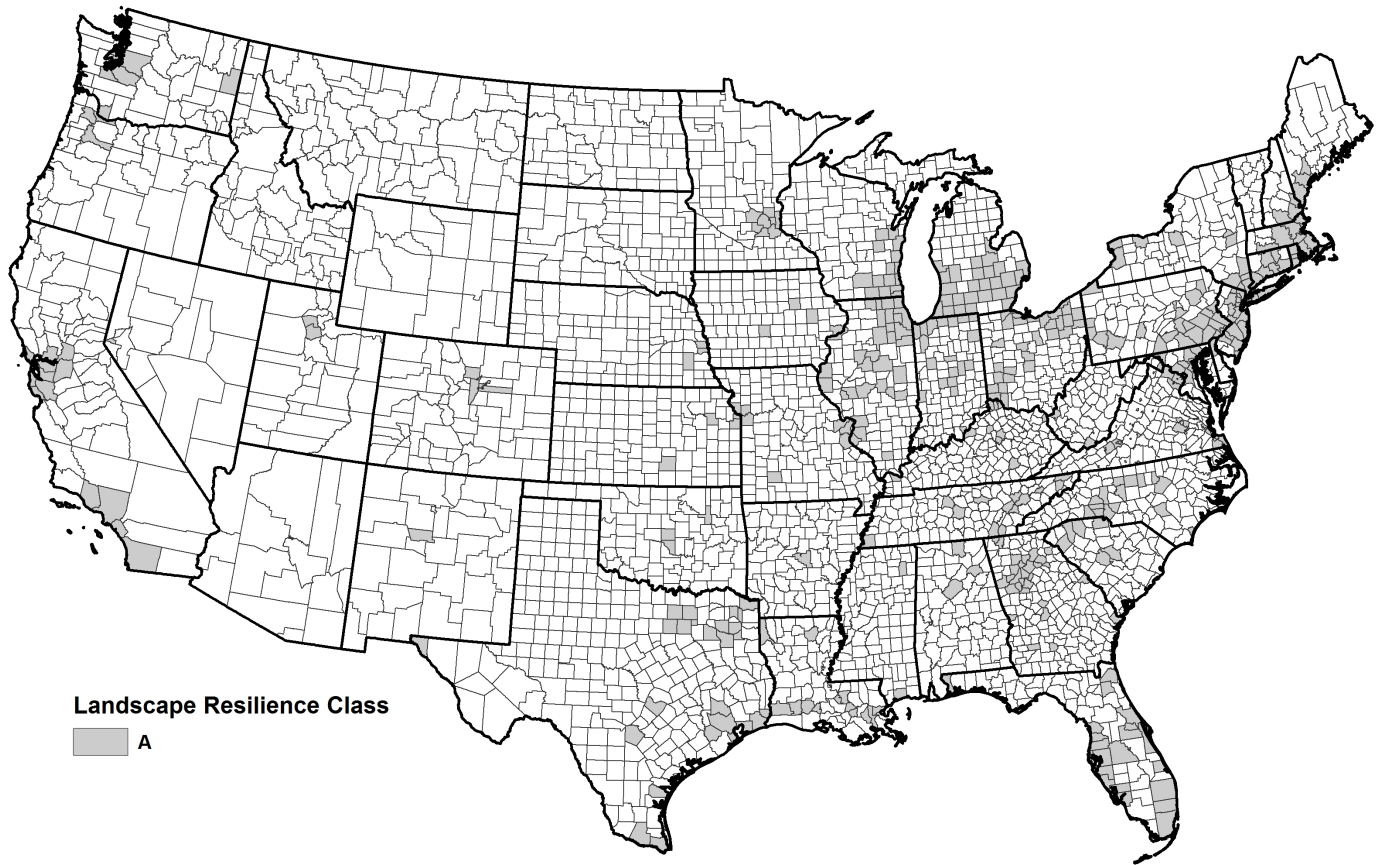


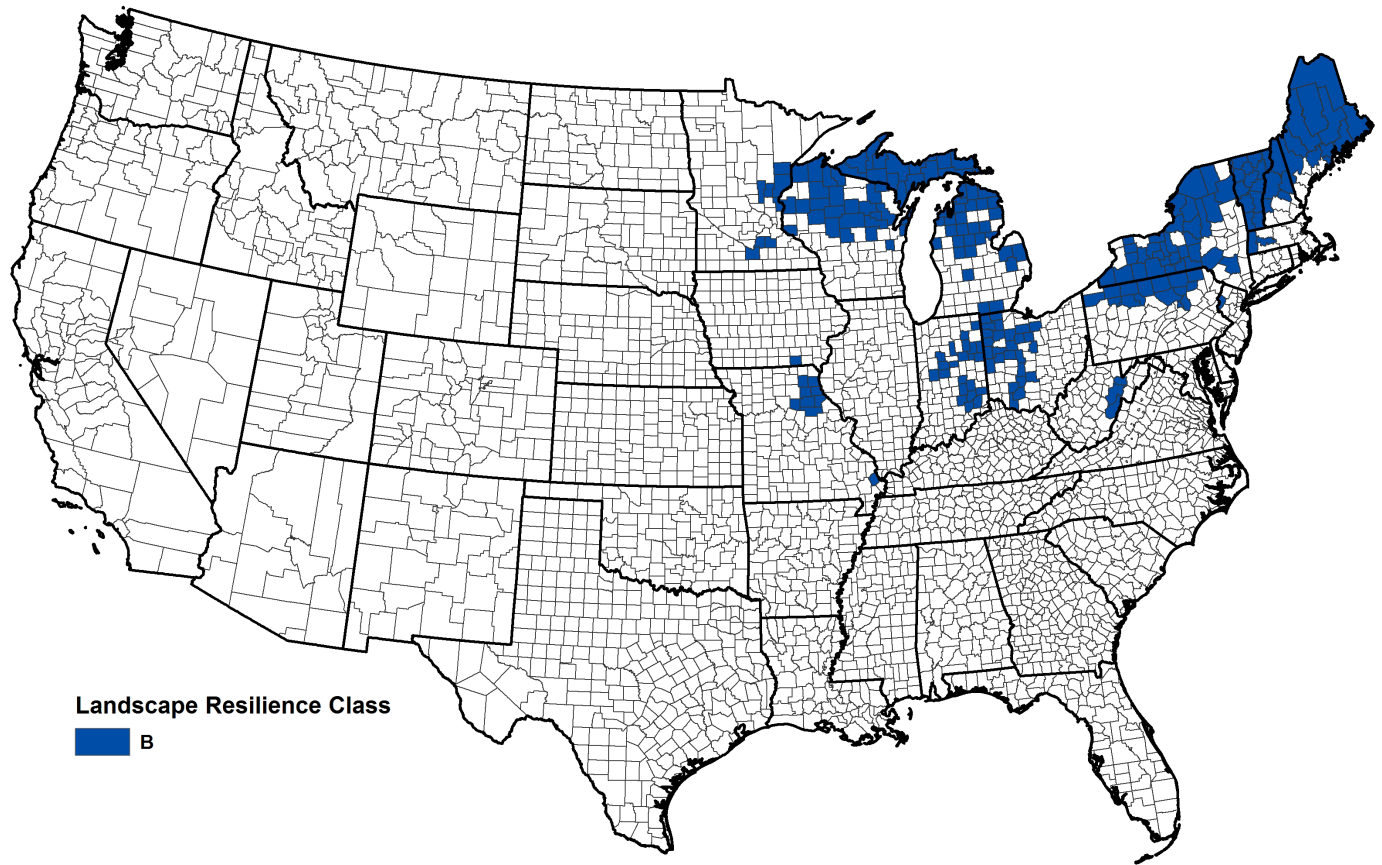
Landscape Class - A



Urban Developed Built

This landscape is characterized by a very urban land cover and represents the most developed counties.

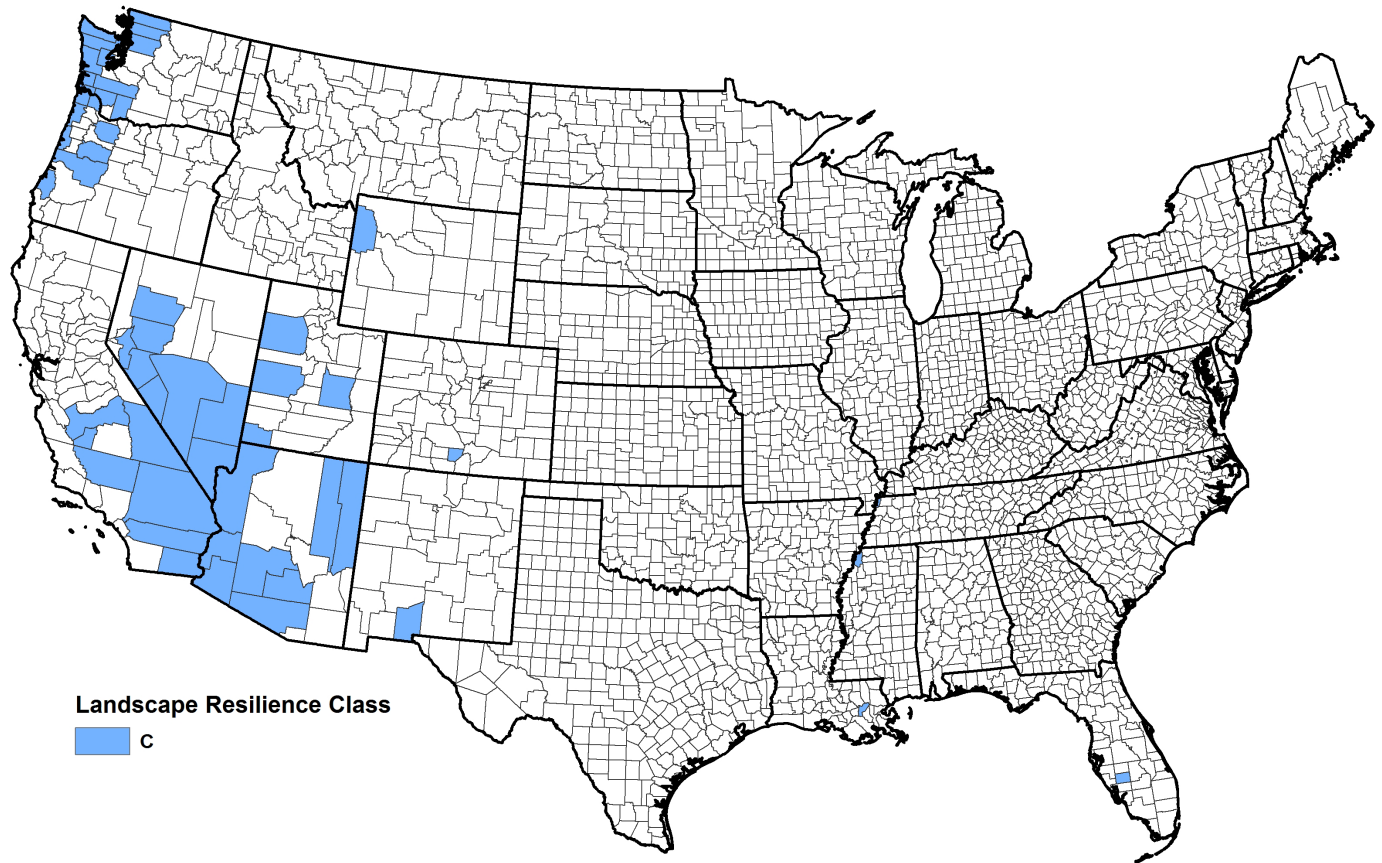
Landscape Class - B



Cool, Wet Northern Forests

This landscape is located in the Northeast Region and is characterized by infrequent (rare) fires that can be severe. (Fire Regime Group 5).

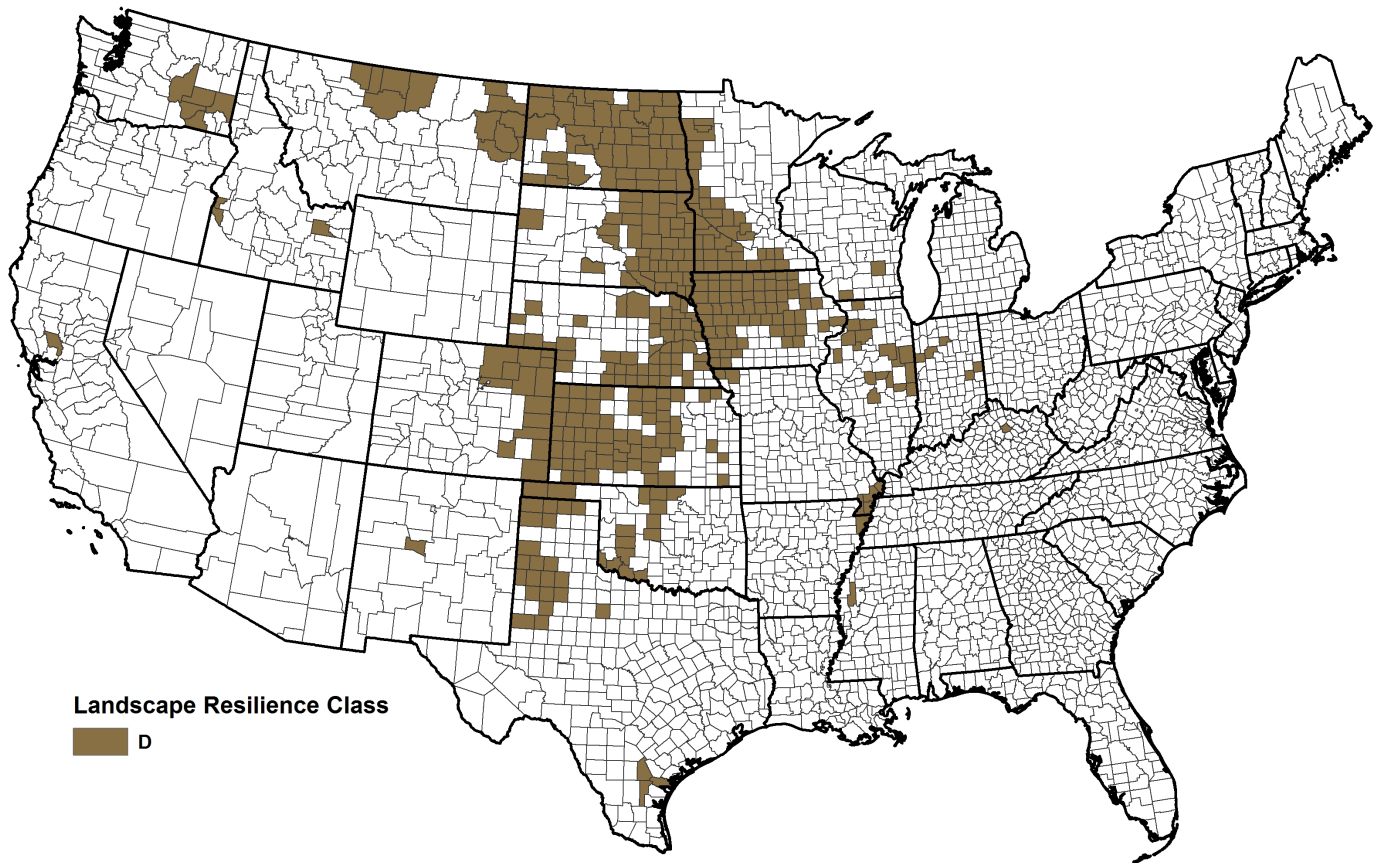
Landscape Class - C



Historically Infrequent Fire (Western)

This landscape is located in the Western Region and is defined by infrequent (rare) fires that can be severe. (Fire Regime Group 5). This class can be separated into the Northwest Coastal Forests and Southwest Deserts, which are two very different landscapes but have similar fire regime characteristics.

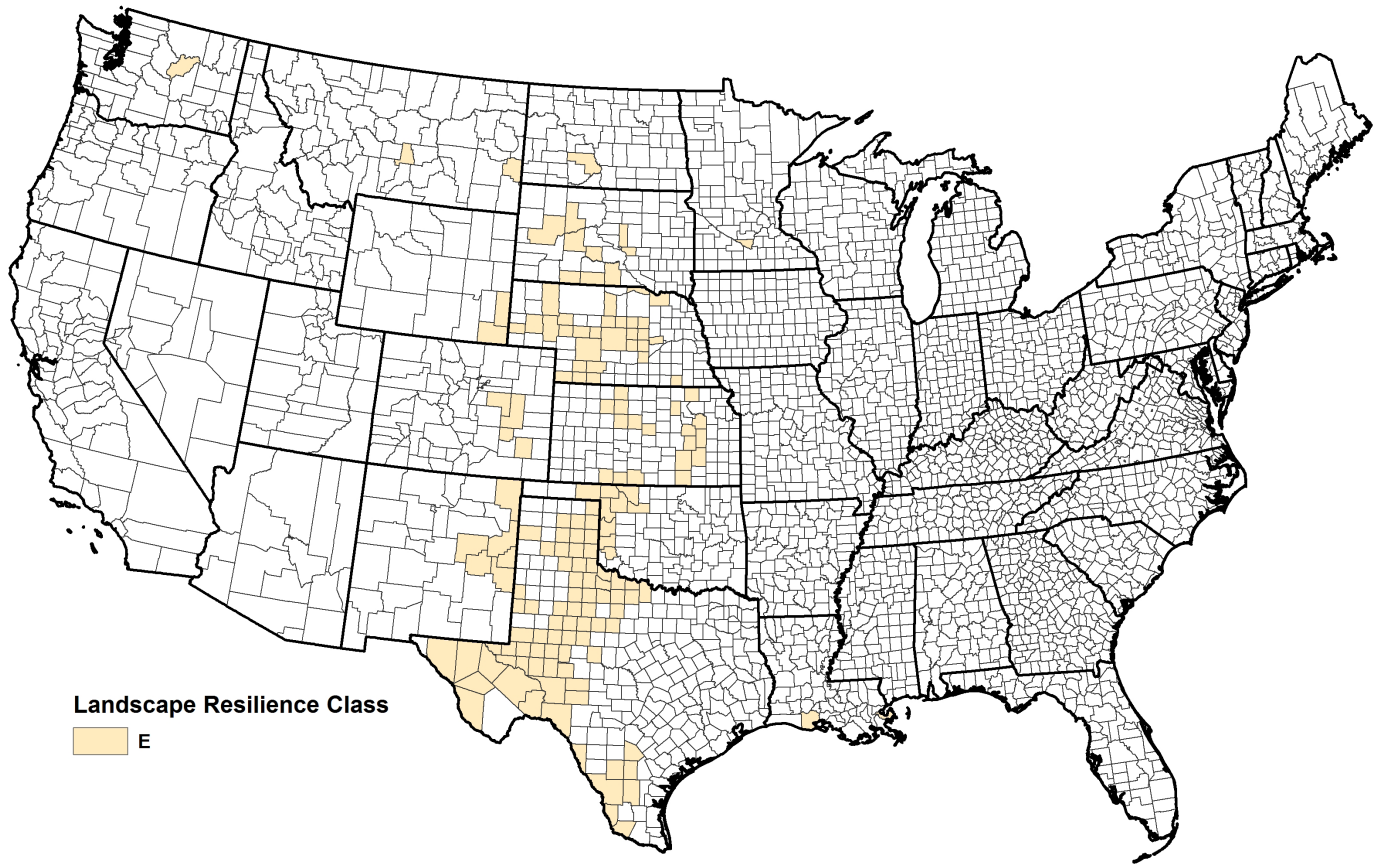
Landscape Class - D



Agriculture and Grasslands

This landscape is dominated by agricultural land use. It is a non-forested landscape.

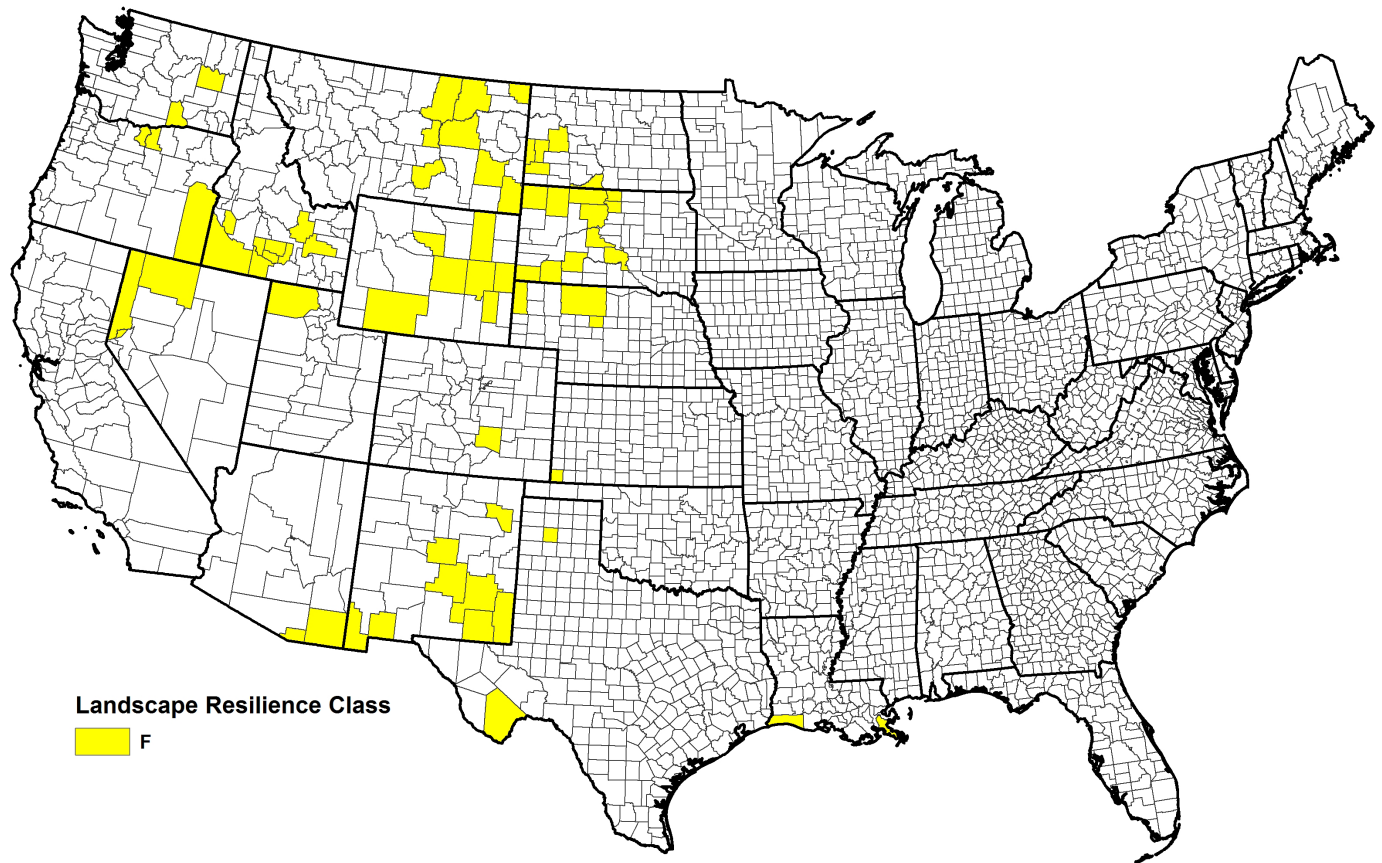
Landscape Class - E



Private Rangelands and Prairies

This landscape is rangeland, showing a mix of natural and converted grasslands..

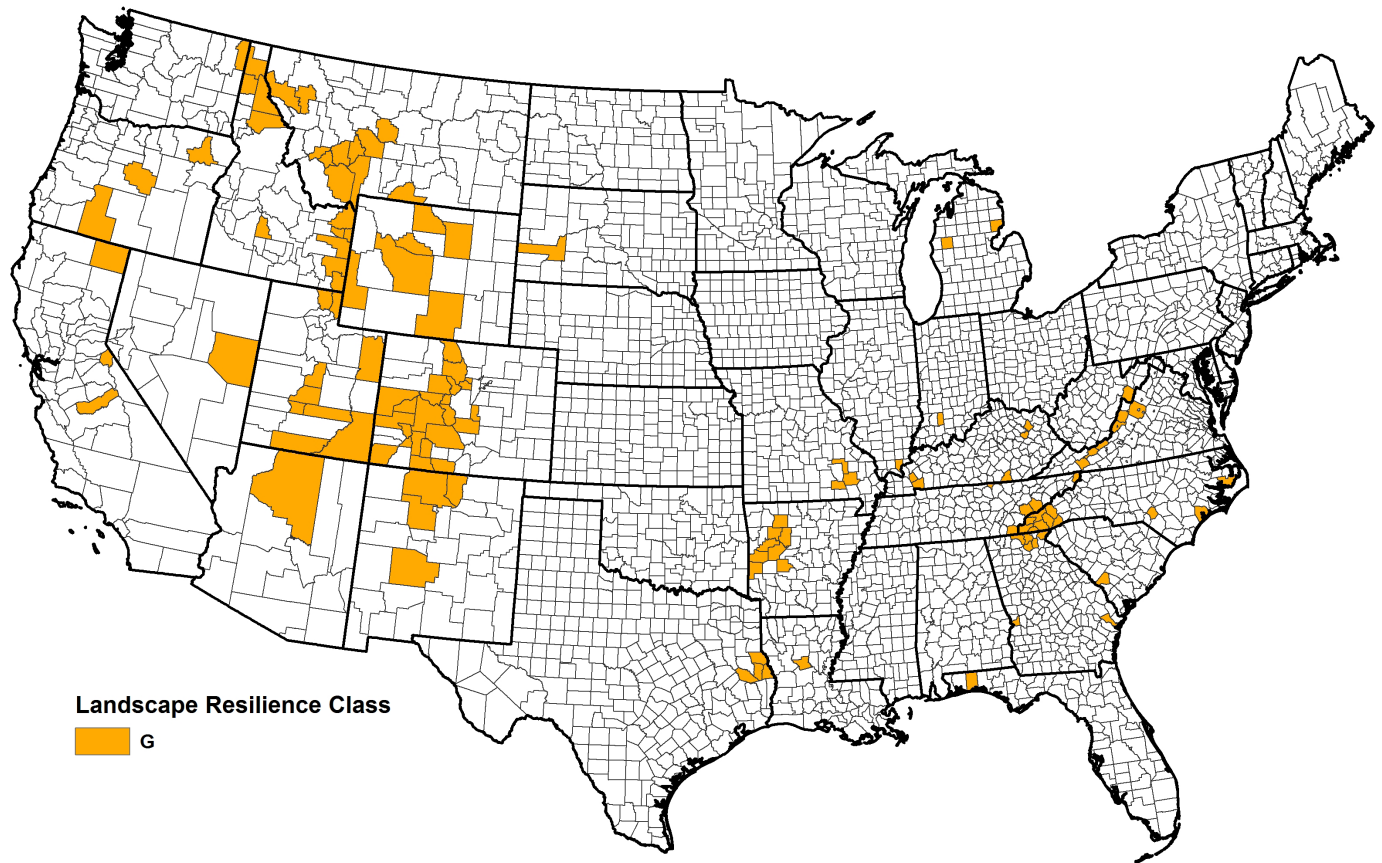
Landscape Class - F



Public Rangelands and Prairies

This landscape is Western rangeland that is dominated by natural land cover with a small percent of embedded forests.

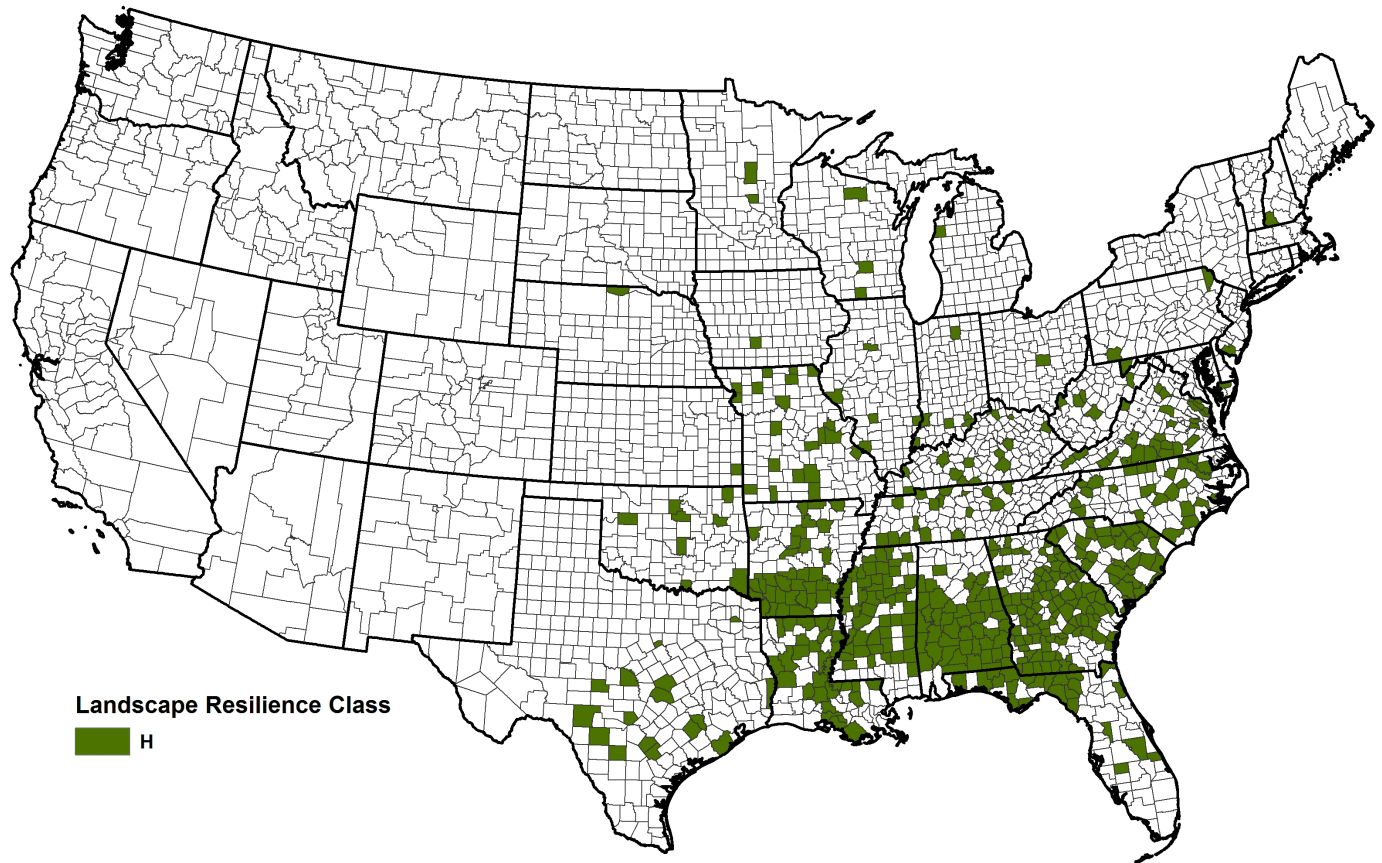
Landscape Class - G



Public Forest Lands, High Fire Potential

This natural landscape is a mainly forested environment that does not have a recent history of large fire, but does have a high potential for burning in the future. There is very high Federal ownership of these lands.

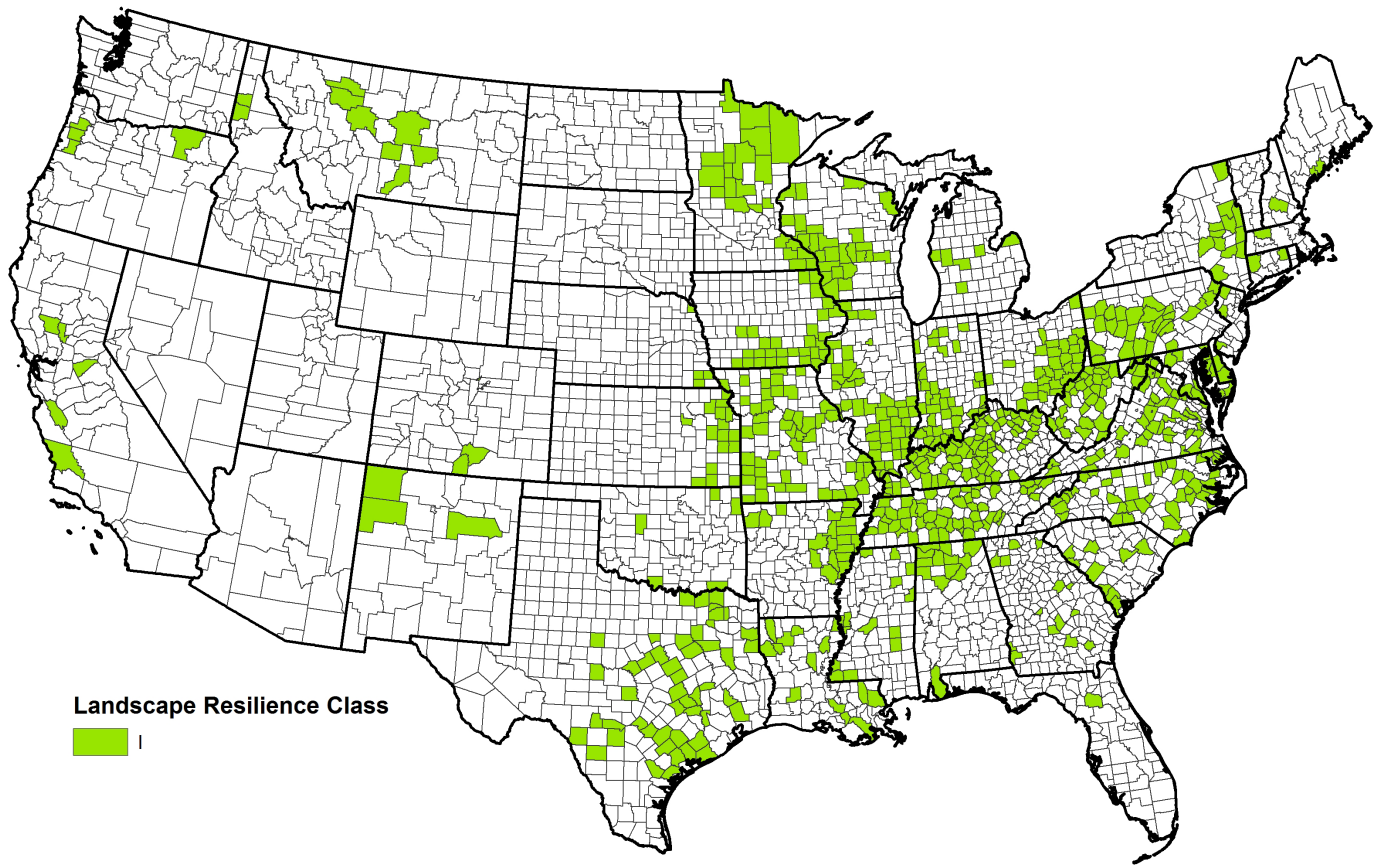
Landscape Class - H



Eastern Forests with ongoing Prescribed Fire

This landscape is dominated by a forested environment with low federal ownership. This landscape experiences frequent historic fire and has a history of prescribed fire use.

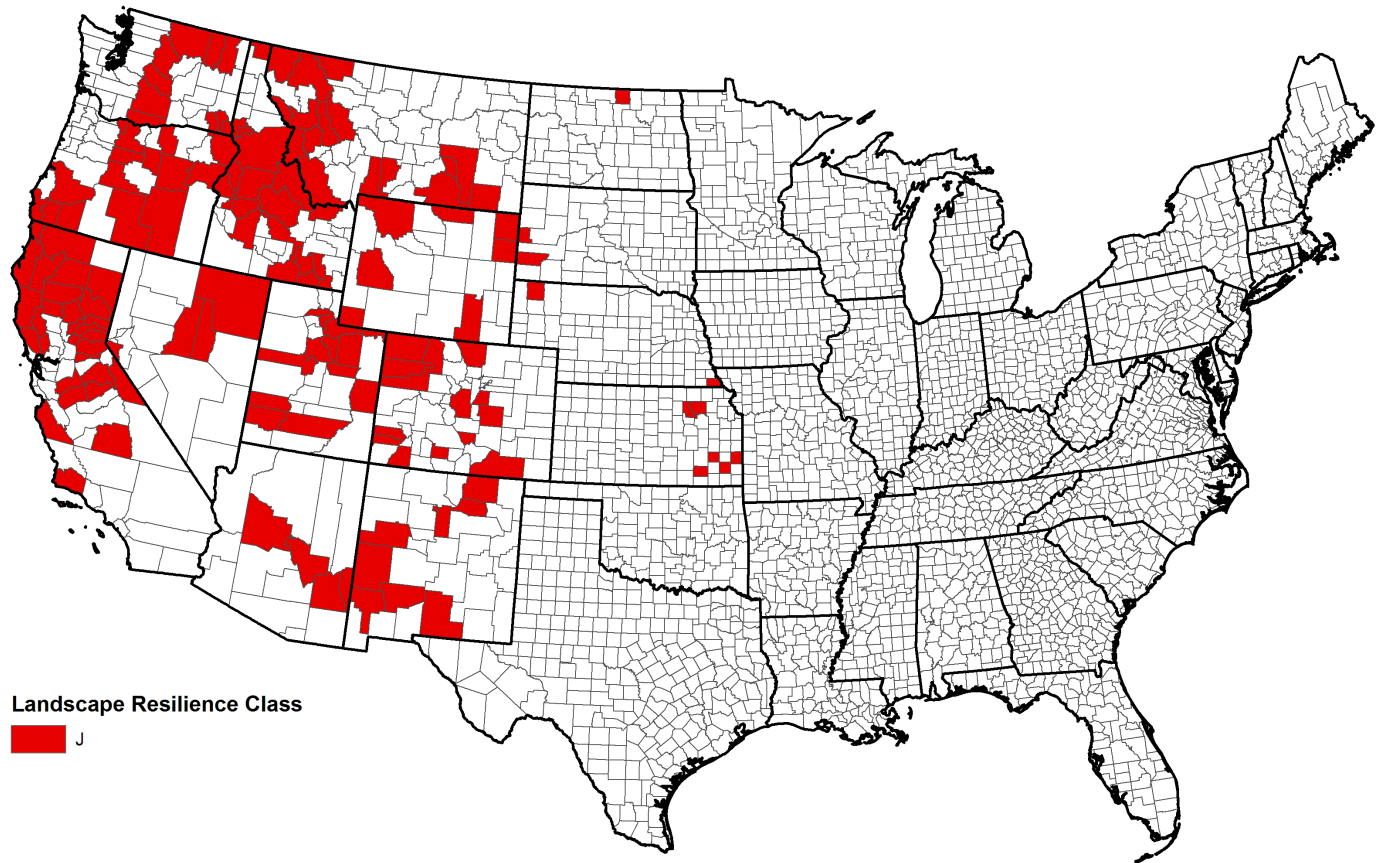
Landscape Class - I



Private Fragmented Forest with less Prescribed Fire

This landscape is dominated by a mixed forested and farmland environment with low Federal ownership. This landscape does not have a history of prescribed fire use..

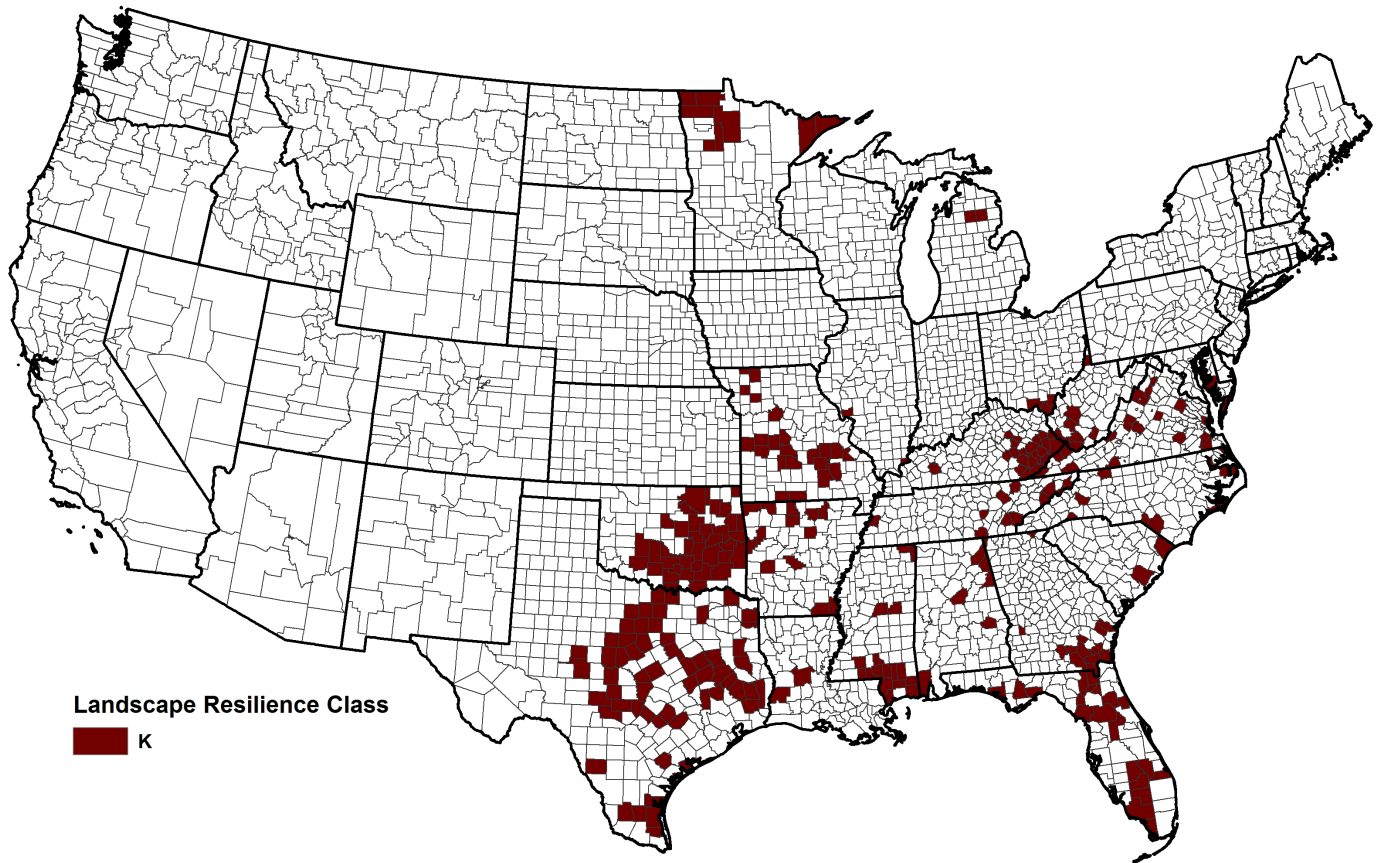
Landscape Class - J



Western Public Lands with Recent Large Fires

This is a natural landscape with high federal ownership and a recent history of large fires. It is dominated by large contiguous blocks of natural vegetation in rural and wilderness settings.

Landscape Class - K



Eastern Mixed Forests with Recent Large Fires

This landscape is a mix of natural and converted land with a moderate amount of forested lands. These counties have a recent history of large fire and high burn probabilities.
